


Appropriations

HF 2643 FY 2021 APPROPRIATION CHANGES

Makes the FY 2021 GF appropriations and other fund appropriations. Allocates \$4.322 billion in total (\$73.9 million below FY 2020 funding levels). Spending for agencies will remain at the same level as FY 2020 for most departments and agencies.

Requires the DOM, in consultation with the LSA, to determine the amount of state and federal appropriations made in FY 2020 and which entities received the money.

Other provisions included in the appropriations bill:

- **Medical Examiner:** Requires the state Medical Examiner and UI to reach an agreement on forensic autopsies.
- Fair: Allows the State Fair Board to use revenue bonds if needed.
- **REAP:** Extends the REAP program to 2023.



- **Alarms:** Prohibits local governments from charging alarm contractors a fee for false alarms or for permits to place or keep an alarm system in service.
- **School Tax:** Makes a property tax fix (Bondurant-Farrar schools).
- **Courts:** Allows clerk of court to serve additional counties. Allows civil trials to be moved to contiguous counties, even in an adjacent court district.
- **Voting:** Strikes the ability of auditors to use the voter registration database to fill in missing information on absentee ballots.
- Regents: Allows the Regents to hire outside counsel for non-court matters.
- Utilities: Allows municipal/REC utilities to do certain work without competitive bids.
- HHS: Allows various funding to carry forward/not revert for various HHS programs, with reporting requirements. Extends the authority for county hospitals to continue bonding under the Governor's proclamations, provisions on federal COVID funds, on MH/DS regions dividing and DHS mediation and oversight, on foster home insurance, on Polk County transfers, on group foster care and increases the age for adult living programs to 23, and other matters.
- Other: Makes changes related to search warrants, county zoning/adjustment board member residency and other matters. Makes corrections.

Effective on enactment. Makes provisions effective as of July 1.
